Administrative Report: Brian Grundusky

- A. Financial Update: BV met its Operating Ratio (OR) for April, which was 96.8% compared to the budgeted OR was 102.5%. Main contributors were expense savings and above revenue pertaining to assisted living. Skilled Nursing did well in occupancy rates. Most of occupancy problems are with Independent Living, where we currently have 18 vacancies in West Apartments.
- B. Century Drive Extension: BV is getting another independent appraisal to give the township to try to increase number of dollars we are due to receive. Currently, we are to receive \$220,000, which will be used to construct the berm, etc. on West side. Will be meeting with concerned residents re the berm and other issues.
- C. People's Bank: Have signed the new lease for the bank to open an office in BV. Process of approvals within the bank will take approximately 30 to 45 days. Bank will be here for the next two weeks working on bank area prior to moving in, as well as plans to install ATMs on both East and West sides of BV.
- D. 2019 Pulse Survey: Deadline for completing survey will be extended for one week. Goal is to have 75% of residents complete the survey. Have actively worked to improve those areas which were highlighted in the last survey: dining services, security and transitioning between levels of care in BV.
- E. Completed the annual survey of the Oaks by the Department of Health. Seven surveyors conducted the survey in three days. Life Safety team was in as well. Did have some very minor deficiencies, <u>none</u> involved quality of care for our residents.
- F. PEPPER: A new technology Asbury is looking into. PEPPER will be at Bethany Village in mid-July. Will be a greeter at the front desk. Will be distributing more information on PEPPER soon,

- 12. <u>Facilities</u> George West, Chair- Plan to work on Friendship roof. To replace roof, will need to request capital funds. Water in garden: need to replace whole system and will include this item in the capital fund budget. Two new sinkholes on East side. Next meeting June 17th. East Cottage power washing delayed a bit because of pollen, etc.: half completed at West Cottages. Road repairs will be included in capital budget too. Also, cleaning downspouts on East and West. Naming of trees is ongoing.

- 16. <u>Library</u> Connie Scheib, Chair Am barcoding our collection in the library and finding many older, good books which have not been read for a long time. They are important to the library, so they will be put in a new section of the library called "Oldies but Goodies". It is located next to the DVD collection, along the back wall. We received a collection of Chautauqua DVD lectures from Mary Ann Morefield, who showed these lectures in the Community Room, and who thought residents might want to review them. They are on the carousel for easy access at any time. We added 19 books during May, with 6 being in large print.
- 17. <u>Model Railroad</u> Lowell Starling, Chair The Garden Train continues to run, weather permitting. Saturday, June 22, the Oaks is having a cookout and the train will run from 12:30-1:30. The Wood Shop continues to work on the new display case for the N gauge in East Breezeway. Finally, Xmas train platform set up outside the pharmacy for a couple of weeks to upgrades to electrical hookups and insulation under the platform.

- 19. <u>Program</u> Judith Clovsky, Chair RC sponsoring two upcoming concerts this month. In Sept/Oct will have trip to Canadian Rockies, and will offer a January cruise.

- 20. <u>Remembrance Garden</u> Dale Meadowcroft, Chair Two new bricks ordered for September installation.
- 21. <u>Spiritual Life Enrichment</u> Lloyd Chorpenning, Chair Communion Room construction completed and beautifully done.
- 22. Wellness Carol Leidig, Chair BV games will fun June 10 21st, approximately 20 people have signed up. The new Mini Golf Course is in use and the Golf League has started: Shuffleboard court has been resurfaced and is in use; Horseshoe pits have been worked on and are now in good shape. Finally, working on ways to reach out to residents with our Enhanced Mobility Program.
- 23. <u>Woodworking</u> Ed Bitzer, Chair Slow month for repairs but completed two small but important projects, one by Ron Savage for a wheelchair ramp to mount a high threshold (surprised we haven't been asked for more of these) and a coat and hat rack. The really bit on going project is progressing with both Ken Kieffer and Ginny Wilt putting in long hours. What is obvious is the quality of craftmanship going into the display case for the M gauge train.
